COMPLIANCE: RULES & PROCEDURE

Re-registration of an inspection body is required annually. At this time a new BACTA registration Number (code) will be issued.

In accordance with the HSE Review of fairground safety a sticker will be required on each device that is to be tested to indicate that a current DOC has been issued plus it's expiry date.

A supply of official stickers will be available from BACTA . The stickers will bear the ADIPs logo along with the BACTA logo and will require endorsing with the inspection body's CODE, the unique DOC NUMBER and the EXPIRY DATE.

When this system is established it will be easy to see which machines are compliant. It is realised That a period of time (possibly 12 months to the next expiry date) will be needed before the system could be fully operational, but we should start using the stickers as soon as possible.

When the system is operational any complaints about a device will be investigated by BACTA and any device without a sticker may draw the attention of the local Environmental Health Officer, HSE or BACTAs compliance officer.

All ADIPs inspection body's will be notified immediately stickers become available and will be expected to start using them from the date they are received.
