016. Falsified Certificates

In Technical Bulletin number 010 (May 1992) we reported an instance of unauthorised alteration of details on a certificate of thorough examination issued by one of our members. We have since received some suggestions which might help to make such forgery more difficult to achieve. We think the following may be helpful :-

1. Consecutive numbering of certificates simplifies cross-checking.
2. Certificates having a background pattern make Tippex or similar alterations more obvious.
3. Ask operators to inform the Appointed Person if a ride is sold.
4. Include a note explaining that the certificate is valid only for the person named. A revised certificate could then be issued following transfer of ownership.
